



UNDERSTANDING THE ONGOING IMPLEMENTATION OF **REV360 AND TAXPAYER IDENTIFICATION (TAX ID): A STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE.**

01. Introduction

The Nigeria Revenue Service (NRS) launched Rev 360 on the 30th of April 2026 as part of its Tax Administration 3.0 initiative, marking a major step in the modernization of Nigeria's tax administration system. The recent one is the NRS' notice dated 18th of May 2026 in respect of the implementation of Taxpayer Identification (Tax ID), requiring taxpayers to obtain a unified Tax ID that would ensure a seamless interaction with different tax authorities.

The Rev 360 is designed to create a more integrated, efficient, and user-friendly digital tax environment for businesses and taxpayers across the country. The platform is expected to improve tax compliance processes through faster processing, enhanced taxpayer access, better record management, and a more seamless interaction between taxpayers and the tax authority by providing a more connected and streamlined platform.

How Does Rev360 Differ from TaxPro Max?

Rev 360 is the new digital tax administration platform introduced to modernize and improve tax processes in Nigeria. Rev 360 was introduced as an upgrade to, and eventual replacement for, TaxPro Max. The platform is designed to simplify tax administration by bringing everything together in one system, making it faster and easier to use.

While TaxPro Max primarily focused on tax filing and payment processes, Rev 360 is expected to deliver a broader and more connected tax management experience by bringing multiple tax-related activities into one unified ecosystem.

One of the major improvements introduced by Rev 360 is its enhanced tax payer experience. The platform is expected to provide a cleaner and more intuitive interface, making it easier for businesses and taxpayers to navigate tax processes, complete filings, and access important information with fewer difficulties. In addition, Rev 360 aims to improve the integration of tax activities by centralizing filing, payment, taxpayer information, and compliance processes within a single environment, helping businesses reduce duplication and manage records more effectively.



What Existing and New Taxpayers should know?

The migration to Rev 360 affects all categories of taxpayers and stakeholders, including existing taxpayers, new businesses, and tax professionals who support compliance activities.

For **existing taxpayers** currently registered on TaxPro Max, migration to Rev 360 is already in progress. These users may be required to reset passwords, verify their details, or update their email addresses before they can fully access the new platform. Although the process has recently been simplified, the same TaxPro Max login details can now be used as credentials to access Rev360, eliminating the need for an additional registration process to obtain new login credentials.

For **new taxpayers**, all tax registration activities are now carried out directly on Rev 360 through the self-service portal. This means new companies will no longer be onboarded on TaxPro Max but will instead complete their registration, obtain their Tax Identification Number (TIN), and manage compliance processes entirely on Rev 360.

The Tax Consultant Feature on Rev 360

One of the key features introduced on Rev 360 is the Tax Consultant feature, which allows businesses to work more seamlessly with their tax consultants and finance professionals on the platform. Instead of sharing login details informally, taxpayers can now link authorized consultants to their profiles, making it easier for them to assist with filings, tax payments, reconciliations, Tax Clearance Certificate (TCC) applications, and other compliance activities in a more secure and organized manner.

This feature is expected to improve efficiency, accountability, and overall workflow management amongst taxpayer, its consultants, and NRS. While companies maintain better oversight of activities carried out on their tax profiles, consultants can manage client obligations more effectively within one centralized system. However, companies should grant access only to trusted and authorized representatives in order to protect sensitive taxpayer information and maintain proper internal controls.

Implementation of Tax Identification (Tax ID)

The Tax ID serves as a single, unified identity for all taxpayers, enabling seamless interaction with tax authorities at both the federal and sub-national levels and it is designed to consolidate taxpayer records, eliminate duplication and ensure more efficient management of tax-related information.

According to the NRS notice, all Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs), financial institutions, and other organisations currently using the TIN validation API have been advised to migrate to the Tax ID system.

Key Benefits of the Tax ID are single Tax Identity, Simplified Compliance, Transparency, Enhanced Revenue Assurance, Data Harmonization.

Companies are encouraged to take proactive steps such as confirming that taxpayer information is accurate and ensuring registered email addresses remain active. Early account activation, including password resets where required, should be prioritised to avoid unnecessary delays or compliance pressure close to filing deadlines.

Informal sharing of login details should be avoided, with preference given to structured access options such as the Tax Consultant feature, which enhances both security and accountability.

Overall, businesses should approach this transition as an opportunity to improve efficiency and streamline tax processes rather than a disruption, as proper preparation will make compliance easier, more transparent, and more reliable going forward.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE: REV 360 & GETTING YOUR TAX ID.

NEW TAX PAYERS

Step 1: Visit the Rev 360 Portal

Go to the official Rev 360 self-service portal: selfservice.nrs.gov.ng. Click on Create new account to begin your registration process.

Step 2: Select your Taxpayer type

Choose the taxpayer category that applies to your business. For companies and limited liability entities, select Corporate.

Step 3: Enter Your CAC Details

Input your CAC Registration Number (RC Number). The system will automatically connect to the Corporate Affairs Commission (CAC) database and retrieve your company details.



Step 4: Verify Ownership

A One-Time Password (OTP) will be sent to the email address or phone number linked to your CAC registration details. Enter the OTP to confirm that you are authorized to register the company on the platform.

Step 5: Complete Your Business Information

You will be required to confirm and provide additional business details, including: Business address, date of commencement of business, accounting year-end, business sector and branch details (if applicable).

Step 6: Select Your Tax Office

Choose your preferred or nearest tax office. This will determine the tax office responsible for managing your tax records and compliance activities.

Step 7: Create Your Login Credentials

Set up your login details, including: Username, password and security details.

Step 8: Upload Supporting Documents & Submit your registration

Depending on the nature of your business, you may be required to upload supporting documents such as: Director's means of identification, utility bill and other verification documents. Carefully review all the information provided before submitting your application. Once submitted, the system will process your registration request.

Your Tax ID will be generated and your company will officially be registered on Rev 360.

EXISTING TAX PAYERS

Step 1: Access the Rev 360 Portal

Visit the Rev 360 self-service portal at: selfservice.nrs.gov.ng.

Step 2: Reset Your Password

On the login page, click on “Reset Password.” Enter the email address linked to your TaxPro Max profile. Please note that this must be the email registered on your TaxPro Max account. After entering the email address, click “Send Reset Link.”

Step 3: Check Your Email

Open your email inbox and locate the password reset email sent by Rev 360. Click the reset link provided in the email and create a new password for your account. If you do not receive the email immediately, kindly check your spam or junk folder.

Step 4: Login to Rev 360

Return to the Rev 360 page and sign in using your registered email address and newly created password, once entered click Login to access your account.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE: HOW A COMPANY CAN ADD A TAX CONSULTANT ON REV 360

Step 1: Log In and Access the Tax Consultant Section

Log in to your company account on the Rev 360 self-service portal using your registered credentials. Once inside the dashboard, navigate to the Tax Consultant section, where consultant-related settings are managed.

Step 2: Add Consultant and Enter Details

Click on Connect Account to begin the process. You will then be required to input the consultant’s Tax Identification Number. Then click on request connection which will send an invitation or authorization link to the consultant.

Step 3: Consultancy Approval and access management

The consultant will then log into their own account and accept the invitation to be linked to your company profile. Once the consultant accepts the request the tax authority verification, the consultant is granted access based on assigned permissions. Companies can later update, restrict, or remove consultant access at any time through the same section of the dashboard.

STEP-BY-STEP GUIDE: HOW TO OBTAIN A TAX ID

Step 1: Go to the Official Portal

Visit the official portal at <https://taxid.nrs.gov.ng/> to access the digital Tax ID Retrieval method.

Step 2: Select Entity Type and Provide Identity Numbers

Select whether you want to retrieve a Tax ID for an Individual or an Organization (Corporate):

- **For Individuals:**

You must input your National Identification Number (NIN). To cross-reference and verify your identity in real-time, you will also be required to provide your First Name, Last Name, and Date of Birth.

- **For Corporates/Organizations:**

Select your organization/entity type and enter your RC Number (Corporate Affairs Commission registration number).

Step 3: Consent and Select Retrieve Tax ID

Tick the consent box, then click the Retrieve Tax ID button. If your details match active national registries, the system will instantly verify your identity and display your 13-digit unified Tax ID

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
